DAY 1

9:45 am Depart Fairbanks on guided ground tour with your Northern Alaska Tour Company guide.

Meet your Coldfoot Camp guide who will take you the rest of the way north to Coldfoot.

7:30 pm - Arrive Coldfoot. 8:00 pm

Overnight Coldfoot Camp

DAY 2

Morning Free time to relax and explore on your own.

Depart Coldfoot by air for Fairbanks.

Travel by small plane can vary in Alaska's Arctic. Departure time could be as early as 11:00 am, or as late as 5:00 pm. Stop by the Coldfoot Café by 9:00 am on Day 2 to reconfirm your departure time OR check with the Coldfoot Camp guide the night prior as we may have a better idea of the flight time for your particular date of travel.

The exact schedule of each tour varies day-to-day and is dictated by the interests of the group and unique events of the day, not by a rigid pre-set itinerary.

SAFETY IN THE WILDERNESS

It is important that travelers with Northern Alaska Tour Company understand that Alaska's Arctic is a truly remote wilderness region. Traveling through vast wilderness stretches requires adequate time and preparation. Weather or mechanical factors, albeit infrequent, can result in multi-hour delays. Medical facilities are limited. Limited communication and transportation infrastructure inherently cause evacuation for illness or other emergency situations to take, at the very best, several hours to conduct. For this reason, travelers to this region should be of reasonable health and physical condition.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

TOUR VEHICLES

Northern Alaska Tour Company strives to provide a personalized touring experience. Touring is done in small groups utilizing a 25-passenger tour coach. Occasionally, a 15-passenger van is used for smaller groups or special circumstances. The flight portion of the tour is conducted in 9-passenger aircraft: Piper Navajo Chieftains or Cessna Caravans.

FLIGHT WEIGHT / LUGGAGE

It is very important to limit yourself to one hand-carry size bag per person for your overnight bag. This will need to be a soft sided bag, like a back pack, duffle or tote bag. Nothing with wheels. If needed, Northern Alaska Tour Company can store excess baggage while you are traveling with us.

WEIGHT LIMIT: Baggage is limited to 15-20 pounds per person. Guests with luggage over 20 may be asked to leave items in storage.

FOOD

Food is not included on this adventure. Guests may bring their own snacks/food.

As part of check in you can order lunch for the ground tour from Yukon River Camp. You would receive this lunch at approximately 3:00 pm.

Once at Coldfoot Camp you can purchase all other meals or snacks at the Truckers Café.

RESTROOMS

Outhouses are the norm for the Dalton Highway. Frequent rest stops are made along the tour route. The longest time period between stops is approximately 2 1/2 hours.

GUIDES

Northern Alaska Tour Company guides are highlytrained individuals who are able to share their unique understanding of Alaska with you based on their personal experiences. We are confident that you will find the level of service provided by your guide to be as high or higher than you have ever before experienced.

GRATUITIES

Gratuities Policy: As with other service industries, tips are not required but are used to reward guides for a job well done. Standard tip amounts range from \$15.00-\$25.00+ per guest, per day for excellent service.

ACCOMMODATIONS

In the spirit of the remote wilderness, the overnight accommodations consist of very basic, clean rooms that are extremely rustic by urban standards. There are private toilet and shower stalls in each room. Pay telephones are available.

WHAT TO WEAR / BRING

Dress for comfort, not to impress. Wear comfortable walking-type shoes that can get a bit soiled in the event of rain, dress in layers, and bring a medium-weight jacket.

We also recommend a reusable water bottle. Bring it full and you can refill it at the Yukon River Camp on the ground tour north and then again at Coldfoot Camp while you are there.

SAFETY

Guides are licensed to operate commercial vehicles. Tour vehicles are CB radio and satellite phone equipped. Vehicles are inspected by our maintenance crew after each tour.

ALTERATION

PLEASE NOTE: Guest safety <u>always</u> takes precedence over convenience. On rare occasions, weather or other uncontrollable circumstances may require alteration/cancellation of a portion or all of the scheduled tour itinerary.

If the tour requires an additional overnight stay due to weather or other uncontrollable circumstances, the cost of accommodations and meals is the guest's responsibility.

If the weather requires us to change the return method of travel from air to ground, no price alteration will be made.
